Finds hope in the commitment of our Baptist heritage and identity to religious freedom and human rights for all people of all religions to live together at peace with each other. We affirm our oneness with our Arab **and Israeli** brothers and sisters in Christ as **together** we follow the example of Jesus Christ in word and deed.

Calls for unity among the member Unions of the European Baptist Federation with all Christians in the Middle East, especially our Arab Baptist brothers and sisters, encouraging them in this season of social unrest and political uncertainty. We welcome meaningful dialogue and encourage a fresh engagement of peaceful and legal processes set up for purposes of freedom, justice and democracy.

Condemns every form of violent protest and repression of peaceful demonstrations in the Arab World and expresses great concern about recent attacks made on Christians and Christian churches by extremist groups, especially in Egypt and Iraq.

Encourages Baptists in the Middle East to explore further how an authentic Christian witness can be made with conviction, courtesy and respect in a Muslim majority context.

Invites the world family of Baptists to pray and work for freedom and justice in the **Middle East** and Arab world, **seeking** a just solution for the ongoing conflict between Israel and Palestine and to participate in our Unions through local justice and peace initiatives in the member countries of the European Baptist Federation.
